







2024-2025 Mentor Participation

69 Peer mentors support an average of 5.6 mentees

6 mentors were previously mentees





"Had a video chat with [mentee]. We talked and got to know each other. We talked about what classes she is in. She is struggling with EMT and Math. I will provide her information and connections to the tutoring resources available.

What Peer Mentors Do:

- Share their experiences
- Explain how to overcome challenges
- Suggest resources
- Offer new ideas and ways of thinking
- Normalize asking for help
- Identify obstacles to student success
- Encourage student to get out of their comfort zones
- Direct mentees to opportunities and activities that match interests and values

What Mentees Learn:

- There are people like them
- How to manage stress
- How to locate resources
- Where to go for help
- How to register for classes
- How to get involved
- How to find and connection with others
- How to manage time
- Coping strategies from someone who has been in their shoes
